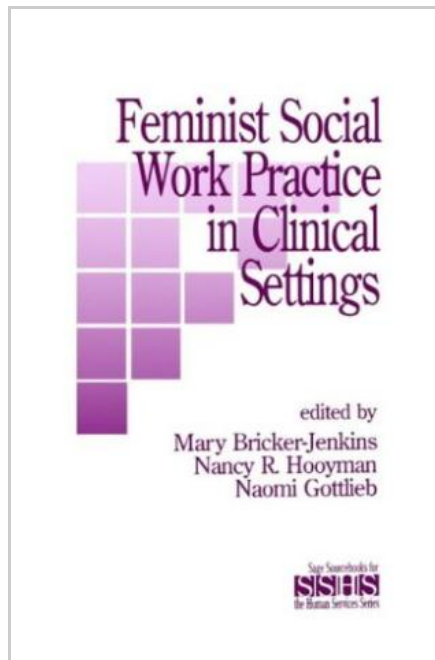




Feminist Social Work Practice in Clinical Settings
